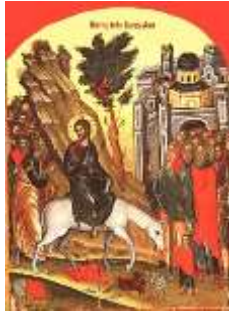

THE MORE YOU KNOW

When the crowds heard that Jesus was approaching Jerusalem, they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, crying, "Hosanna! Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" (John 12:12-13) The word Hosanna is derived from the Hebrew phrase "hoshi'a na" which literally translates as "save now." It was spoken by the Jews as a type of prayerful supplication or appeal unto God, imploring Him to send them their Savior (Messiah). Because of its repetitive use within Jewish liturgical worship, over time, the phrase "hoshi'a na" eventually became abbreviated into a single word.

COLORING EGGS FOR PASCHA

The coloring or dyeing of eggs at Pascha goes back many centuries. The first colored egg is credited to Mary Magdalene. It is said that she went to the Emperor Tiberius and presented him a chicken egg and said "Christ is Risen!" Tiberius became enraged and said that he could not believe such nonsense any more than the white egg she had presented him could turn red. At that very moment the egg did in fact turn red – and since that time we have been dyeing eggs at Pascha.

Many times we buy colored dyes in the store, but if you would like to color them the way they did in the "old country," here are some recipes for color:

Purple – Use 3 to 4 cups of blueberries per quart of water.

Pink – Use 3 to 4 cups of raspberries per quart of water.

Blue Green – Use 4 cups red cabbage per quart of water.

Red/Copper – Use 4 cups onion skins per quart of water.

Yellow – Use 2 tablespoons of turmeric per quart of water.

Bronze – Use brewed coffee instead of tap water.

To dye eggs, simply prepare them for hard cooking as you normally would: place 6 to 8 eggs in a single layer saucepan and fill with tap water until the level is one inch above the eggs. Add 2 tablespoons of white vinegar per quart of water (this helps the color adhere to the eggs).

Then add the natural-dye ingredients and bring the mixture to a boil. Lower heat and simmer for 20 minutes. Remove eggs with slotted spoon and place on paper towels to dry. For even deeper shades, strain the cooking liquid and refrigerate eggs in colored liquid overnight.

To give the eggs a pretty sheen, rub the finished eggs lightly with a soft cloth dipped in vegetable oil.

ORTHODOX CHURCH ETIQUETTE

THE PLASCHINITSA

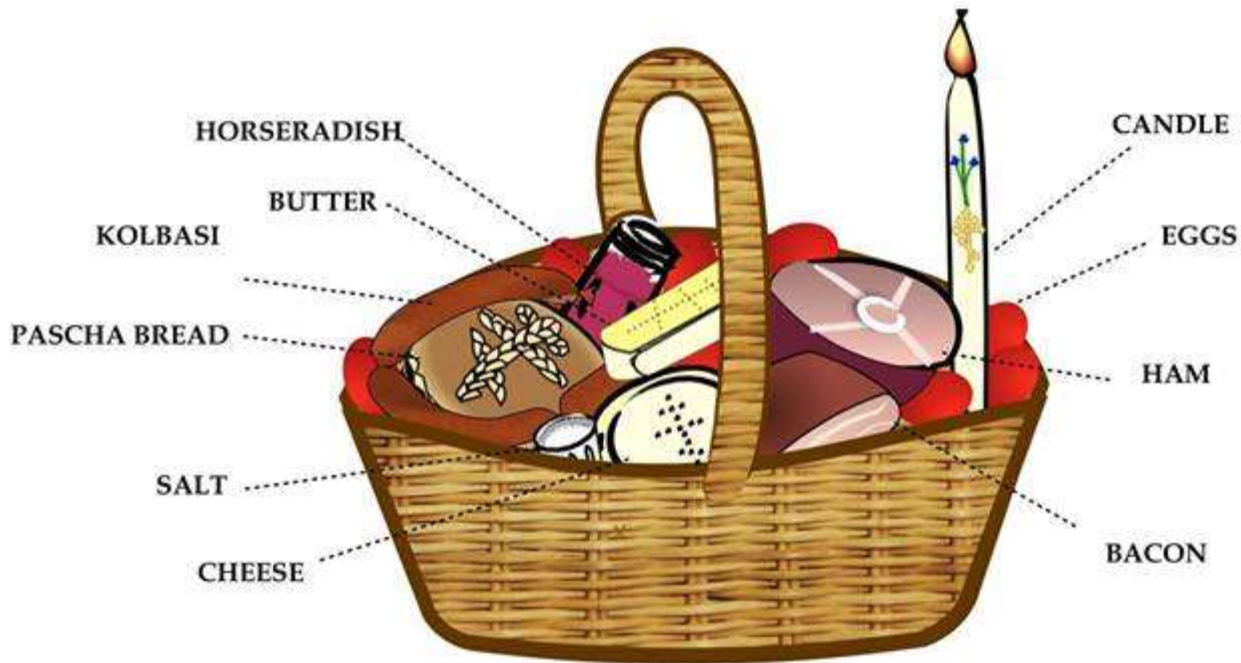
The Plaschinitsa is the winding sheet used during the services of Great and Holy Friday and Saturday which depicts an icon of our Lord being taken down from the Cross (although some simply have the lone, full figure of our Lord lying in repose). The word itself is of Russian origin and means a "shroud" (as in "burial shroud"). Its root, plasch, means an outer cloak or mantle. The Greek word used for this same icon representation is "Epitaphios," which literally means "on the grave" or "on the tomb." This is also from where we get the English word epitaph.

VENERATING THE PLASCHINITSA

Just as you should always venerate the icon in the center of the church whenever entering or exiting, so the Plaschinitsa (Burial Shroud) is to be venerated by all the faithful anytime they come into the church or leave it. During those services when the Plaschinitsa lies in the center of the church, each person should approach with all reverence making 2 prostrations (kneeling to the ground with your forehead touching the floor), kissing both the shroud and the gospel book, then making a third prostration. Since others will be waiting in line, the third prostration is best made to the side of the tomb – out of the flow of the approaching faithful. *[Note: for those not able to make full prostrations due to age, knee replacements, etc., reverent bowing down from the waist is acceptable.]* In addition, women should wipe their lips free of lipstick before venerating the Plaschinitsa, the Cross, or when taking Communion.

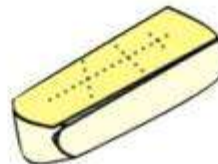


PASCHA - The Easter Bread (Pron. Pa-ska.) A sweet yeast bread rich in eggs, butter, etc. Symbolic of Christ Himself who is our True Bread. Usually round loaf baked with a golden crust decorated with a symbol indicative of Christ. Sometimes a cross (+) of dough is placed on top encircled by a plait given it a crowned effect or Greek

CHEESE - (Rusyn: Hrudka or Sirec) A custard type cheese shaped into a ball having a rather bland but sweet taste indicative of the moderation that Christians should have in all things. Also creamed cheese is placed in a small dish and both are decorated with symbols (see Pascha) out of cloves or pepper balls.



HAM - (Rusyn: Śunka - pron. shoon-ka.) The Flesh meat popular with the Slavs as the main dish because of its richness and symbolic of the great joy and abundance of Easter. Some may prefer Lamb or Veal. This is usually well roasted or cooked as well as other meats so the festivity of the day will not be burdened with preparation and all may enjoy the Feast.

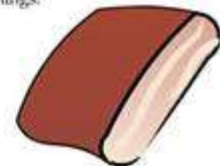


BUTTER - (Rusyn: Maslo pron. ma-slo.) This favorite dairy product is often shaped into a figure of a Lamb or small cross and decorated as the cheese. This reminds us of the goodness of Christ that we should have toward all things.

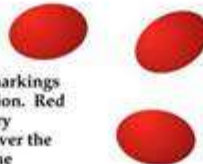


SAUSAGE (Rusyn: Kolbasi-pron. kol-bus-i.) A spicy, garlic sausage of pork products indicative of God's flavor and generosity.

BACON - (Rusyn: Ślanina pron. sla-ni-na) A piece of uncooked bacon cured with spices. Symbolic of the overabundance of God's mercy to us.



EGGS (Rusyn: Pisanki pron. pi-sun-ki) Hardboiled eggs brightly decorated with symbols and markings made with beeswax, indicative of new life and resurrection. Red eggs are also traditional date back to a story with St. Mary Magdalene. Having been dyed with onion skins saved over the past year, red shows the color of life and victory that came through Christ's blood.



SALT - (Rusyn: Sol' pron. sol') A condiment necessary for flavor reminding the Christian of his duty to others.



HORSERADISH (Rusyn: Chrin pron. khrin) Horseradish mixed with grated red beets (optional) symbolizes the Passion of Christ still in our minds but sweetened with some sugar because of the Resurrection. A bitter-sweet red colored mixture reminds us of the sufferings of Christ.

These articles are placed in a wicker basket. A decorated candle is placed inside and is lit at the time of the blessing. A linen cover usually embroidered with a picture of the Risen Christ or symbol with the words "Christ is Risen" is placed over the food when brought to the Church.

In some places a large Easter Bread (Pascha) is made and brought separately in a large linen cloth. If the origin of the people was from a wine growing area, a sweet wine may be brought
