## Q: Why do clergy wear robes?

A: Clerical vestments date back to the time of the Old Testament. The most basic reasons why our clergy (Bishops, Priest, Deacons, etc.) continue to wear them is threefold:

- The wearing of vestments was ordered by God (Exodus 28).
- They serve to designate or “set apart” those who are called to the priestly office.
- They provide a means of “covering” the sinful nature of the individual.

Because the priest stands at the head of the congregation as an archetypal image of Jesus Christ to His people, vestments help mask the frailty of the priest’s human nature and transfigure him as the one who imparts the grace of Christ through the Holy Priesthood. In simplest terms, vestments shift the focus from the man to the priest.

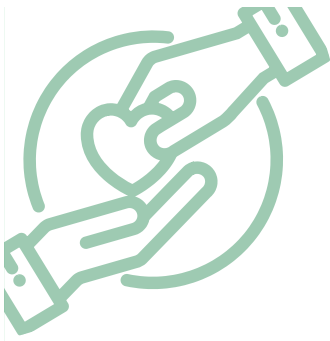

#### Sleep

Sleep is a period of rest that alternates with wakefulness. You have internal body clocks that control when you are awake and when your body is ready for sleep. These clocks have cycles of approximately 24 hours. The clocks are regulated by multiple factors, including light, darkness, and sleep schedules. Once asleep, you cycle through the states of sleep throughout the night in a predictable pattern.

Sleep is important because it affects many of your body's systems. Not getting enough sleep or enough quality sleep raises your risk for heart and respiratory problems and affects your metabolism and ability to think clearly and focus on tasks.

Experts recommend that adults sleep between 7 and 9 hours a night. Adults who sleep less than 7 hours a night may have more health issues than those who sleep 7 or more hours a night. Sleeping more than 9 hours a night is not necessarily harmful and may be helpful for young adults, people who are recovering from sleep deprivation, and people who are sick. How much sleep children should get depends on their age. Sleep experts consider naps to be appropriate for children under age 7.



## Kovalak named First Team All-Suburban League in Girls Golf

North Royalton Senior Golfer Ali Kovalak put up some impressive numbers for the Lady Bears on her way to being named to the post-season, first-team All-Suburban League roster.

During the regular season, Kovalak was the medalist for the Lady Bears (had the lowest score 10 times in the regular season). Kovalak led the team in scoring average (6.5 strokes over par for 9 holes), birdies with 8 and in pars with 76.

In the Final Suburban League regular season Tournament played at Tanglewood Country Club, Kovalak carded one birdie and six pars en route to an 85. The Lady Bears finished second in team scoring that day. That's the best North Royalton has ever scored since the Suburban League adopted the Tournament Scoring format.

There's really no secret why Ali has had a successful season. "The practices that the Coaches have during the week really help and my dad really helps me out a lot." The practices consist of either putting at the Briarwood putting green or playing 9 holes at an area golf course.

For many golfers, if you play bogey golf you are not doing too bad. That puts your score in the mid 40s for 9 holes and close to

90 for a round of 18 holes. "I aim for bogeys. Every once while I get a par and every once in a while, I get a birdie. Really a bogey is not a bad score. But, recently I'm getting more pars."

Ali took up the game of golf 5 or 6 years ago and her dad had a lot to do with getting her started.

"When I first got started my dad was there and helped me out. In the beginning I wasn't as focused on the game as I am now. In the last couple of years, I've been getting better at it and my focus has improved because I am playing better. It's real easy to hit the wrong spot on the club and the ball goes off in a different direction."

Every golfer remembers a shot, a round or a course that strikes a chord with them. All is no different. Her course to remember is Fox Den, where the Ohio High School Athletic Association will have their sectional tournament. "There are a few holes that I remember from playing there last year."

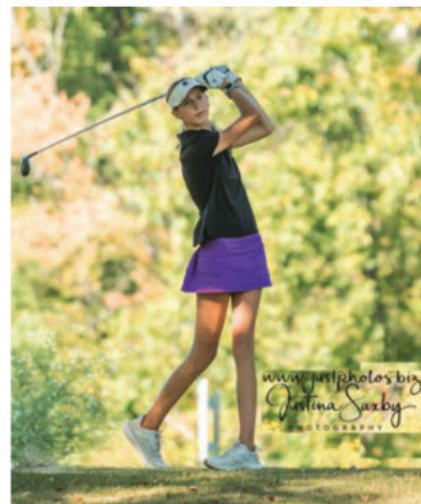
At this point, Ali is not planning to play golf in college, but you never know. If that doesn't happen, Ali will have taken up a game that she can play for the rest of her life. "I think I'll play golf for fun for a while."

Since Ali became a member of the girls' golf team at North Royalton, the sport has

grown substantially. I asked Ali why she thinks some of her teammates have joined the team.

"It's a fun sport to be around. It's very rewarding. The off-season and practice events help to attract lots of my teammates to the sport because they are family oriented."

Congratulations to Ali Kovalak for earning first team All-Suburban League honors and for being part of putting the North Royalton Girls' Golf team on the map.
